


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## MatchUp

I bought this book primarily because of the "matchup" of two of my all-time favorite fiction characters, attorney Bennie Rosato (Scottoline) and detective John Corey (DeMille.) I don't generally like short stories, because they are over too soon, and this one was no exception. A full-length collaboration with these two would be like turning a kid loose in Disneyland. I liked the story as far as it went, however. I was disappointed with Diana Gabaldon's contribution. While it had the Scottish setting of "Outlander," and a brief glimpse of Jamie Fraser, it had the same failings as most short stories. There wasn't enough of it. If you enjoy the authors listed here, and you don't get irritated at the short story format, go for it. While I have not finished all of the stories, most of the ones I have read were worthwhile.

As would be expected some stories were more engaging than others some of the other stories. It was interesting to see how each pair of authors engaged each other's character. Most were unique and fun to learn about while some were lacking in character building that would have strengthened the story's plot. Overall entertaining to read and especially fun to read some stories by authors I would not have learned about.

This was a great way to sample some authors of my favorite genre without having to buy an entire book. I did discover several new authors to read, and one or two that did not appeal at all. The results of the collaborations were really great, the introductions really interesting. Great idea. I will probably get the first volume as well.

I loved the premise behind this book, matching up two popular mystery writers to create one story, each using their most popular character. I got to read new stories featuring some of my favorites and got a glimpse of new-to-me characters that are worth checking out further. If you enjoy any of these authors, I would recommend getting this book. And don't just read the ones that your favorite authors wrote--read them all!

These were great short stories by great match ups. Besides the wonderful stories, they introduced me to a huge group of mystery writers that I wasn't aware. I bought 3 more match ups and I have also found new books with new characters to read.
