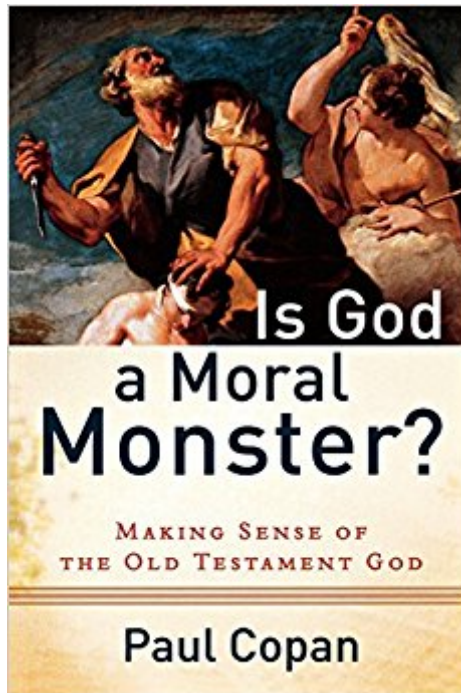




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Is God A Moral Monster?: Making Sense Of The Old Testament God

I really enjoyed this book. It is an easy read but it answers the tough questions any thinking, Old Testament reader probably has. I believe this is a must-read for any Christian and especially anyone who critiques Christianity (because s/he believes the Old Testament can't possibly be accepted as the revelation of the theist God). At least, inform yourself before believing or disbelieving the reliability of that document (much can be said about this, but my suggestion is that you simply read this book before you decide what you believe about the Old Testament--give the book a fair hearing first).

I just finished it and have taken notes on the first 100 pages. I have been a believer for almost 50 years and I learned SO MUCH - no one every helped me understand half of these things before. Also, I "listen" to a lot of neo-atheists and the way the author represented them is exactly what I've found to be true, sorry to say. For a deep book, it's easy to read, which keeps surprising me.

What has been read in the book has been helpful. Dr. Copan's explanations of difficult passages has made sense of some passages that this reader didn't understand. The way he compares the Biblical text to other known religious laws at the same time allows the reader to see that the Biblical text is an advance in ethics. His explanations assist the reader to understand God's reasoning behind what appear to be morally questionable acts. Readers are assured that God directs His people to behave in morally superior ways when placed in comparison to their peers at the time.

The book answered a lot of difficult questions especially those posed by Atheists concerning God's laws as reflected in old testament. This book is useful in understanding the context in which old testament laws were applied and helps answering questions a lot of Christians ask. It is an excellent read for those who oppose and those who believe in the Bible. I personally found the book very powerful and helpful in confirming my faith in God of the Bible.
