

The Wandering Harlot is simply written and largely historically accurate. It is interesting for the way it

illustrates the lot of women who found themselves outside the acceptable roles, whether by choice or not. It is a tale of revenge rather than a romance and the romance element is the most underdone. Perhaps the heroine is luckier in the fictional world than she might have been in real life but the plot is not entirely outlandish and the novel does not romanticise the lot of harlots. It does avoid salacious sexual detail. This is not an erotic peep show but a more serious attempt to deal with the underside of women's lot in the early 15th century. It's not a brilliant book but worth a read.

Using the totally omniscient point of view, author lets us know exactly how to interpret character, not just with our own perception of situation, characters' words, or action in the story. Compelling story line, but most of the characters are Æœbad guys are almost always at a distance from the heroine, and are pure, comic-book evil, with no complexities. Heroine's conflicts and doubts are overly thoroughly analyzed by the story's narrator, so that the reader constantly finds it tempting to skip ahead instead of plodding through what is usually already pretty obvious. Historical scholars may be somewhat put off by what this reader thought were anachronistic elements, like did colleges in the 15th century graduate people they labeled Æœsumma cum laude? (p. 14) ? Did people refer to men as Æœguys way back then (p.106)? Would 15th Century keys be copied by taking a Æœwax impression as might be done with our keys today (p. 185)? Would a medieval whore refer to her partners as Æœtwo cash cows? (p. 219)? And would a noble lady describe an expedient action as being in accord with Æœthe law of the jungle? (p.444)? Et cetera. However, I thought the historical research was impressively thorough and cleverly worked into the fabric of the novel. Some of these problems may be attributable to the translator, Lee Chadeayne.

After reading the beginning section that builds the plot, I had to put down and walk away. The time left women with no power and limited choices. I was angered. I came back to it weeks later to follow the development of the "harlot" through her very difficult life watching her find the strength to survive and find the power to help others while finding revenge.

Marie is the type of character that you can't wait to read what happens next. For a merchant's

properly reared daughter, she is very adaptable to her circumstances and manages to use them in a way to not only save herself, but others too.
