

Just got finished reading this book. It's an unflinching, dark tale about a high school freshman named Jerry Renault, who decides to buck the trend by refusing to participate in the annual chocolate sale, at first as part of a prank, then, as an act of rebellion, incurring the wrath of not only Brother Leon, the headmaster regent, but also of the vigils, which is a school sanctioned secret society. The book's a little on the short side (only about 250 pages long) and the ending was somewhat abrupt, but it's overall a good read, with a depressing, but true message about

conformity.

I loved this book when I read it in middle school. I had to have a copy because of one quote from the book. "Do I dare to disturb the universe?" It has been a motivating quote for many years.

So lemme see if I got the lessons of this book straight: 1. Adults are useless. 2. Evil always wins. 3. It is useless to defy evil. Got it.
