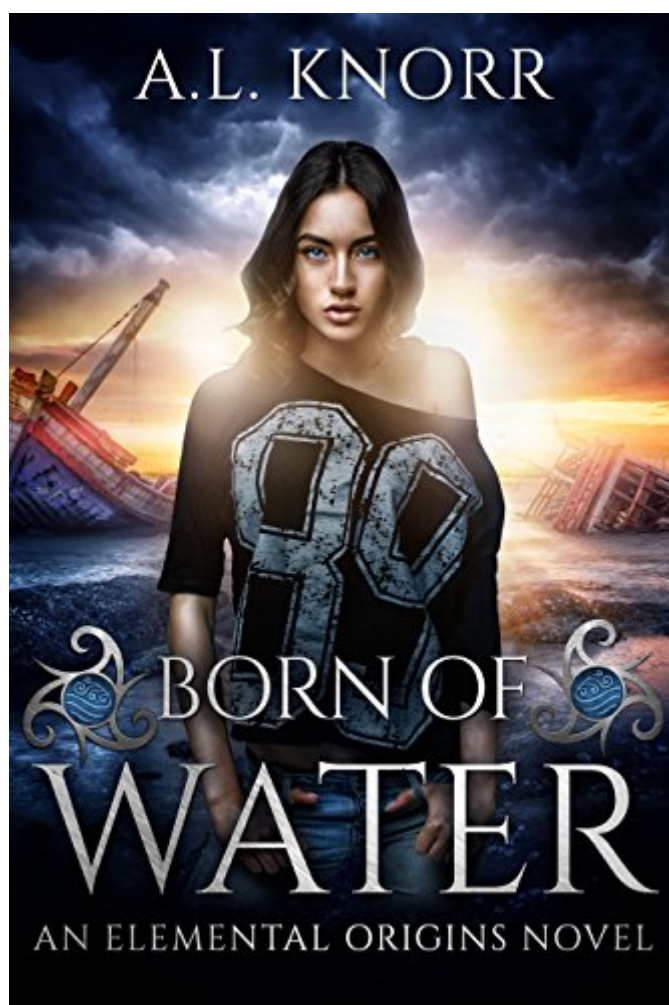


The book was found

With summer's approach, Targa and her friends will be parting ways, all headed to different countries. But Targa's trip to Poland with her mom and mom's dive team turns out to be anything but a typical summer tourism trip. Loved this mermaid story. The details of mermaid anatomy are incredible, and even the "info dumps" feel like so much a part of the story that they're not tedious or tiresome. Even better, this book is part of a series, and it seems that all of Targa's friends have something a little ... different. :) So glad I snapped this book up! And if you like YA mermaid stories, you might also enjoy *Shearwater: Ocean Depths Book One* and *Skye's Lure: A Clean Contemporary YA Fantasy*. I also recently read the prequel short story *Returning: Episode I*, and enjoyed that as well, so if you like this and want to dive into some of Targa's mom's backstory, that's a great place to go. :)

The writing and editing are excellent. Sadly, the story is lacking. I was promised Fyre Festival with luxury accommodations and gourmet food. I got a tent and cheese sandwich. Nothing happens for

the first 30% of the novel. At 30% the girl has an episode in the ocean and claims her heritage. Before then, nothing. A bunch of teenagers chatting about what they'll do over summer break, boys, girls, and underwater salvage. We don't see any salvage, just an offhand mention that it's there. I really wanted to finish this book, but it has given me no confidence that the next thirty percent is going to be any more engaging than the first 30. It's unfortunate, because the author's skill and talent is very good, but readers can't slog through the first half of a book without getting at least a hint as to some sort of actual plot.

And the Novak old man was really an interesting character. I loved how he interacted with all the others.
