

This is a beautiful and moving poem. I personally find it somewhat unsettling as I feel it is something of a "call to arms" on behalf of others who were killed serving in battle. As I have aged I am more and more in favor of peace, whenever possible, and I have always felt that World War 1 was an example of failed statesmanship and an attempt to preserve monarchies. The poem itself became part of the war effort. So although the poem itself is beautiful, it leaves me in a state of cognitive dissidence. As far as the product itself, it is almost more of a pamphlet than a book. It is very nicely done but fairly brief.

My grandfather lives on Flanders road and came across the poem and wanted it for christmas. I got online and found the poem, typed it up on decorative paper and put it in a picture frame. I then came across this book and thought it would be the perfect addition to his picture/poem. It is a softcover book, which I wasn't a huge fan of but the book itself was laid out nicely. It incorporated pages with the poem, then explained more in depth, the meaning of each section; it mixed in some pages that were just pictures such as soldiers on the fields and stuff. It was a very eye opening book, with the history of the poem. Needless to say, on Christmas day my grandpa was THRILLED!!! He was so excited!! He thought we had forgotten that he wanted the poem and we saw the book he was even more excited. He is a huge history buff and couldn't wait to get home to read the book.
