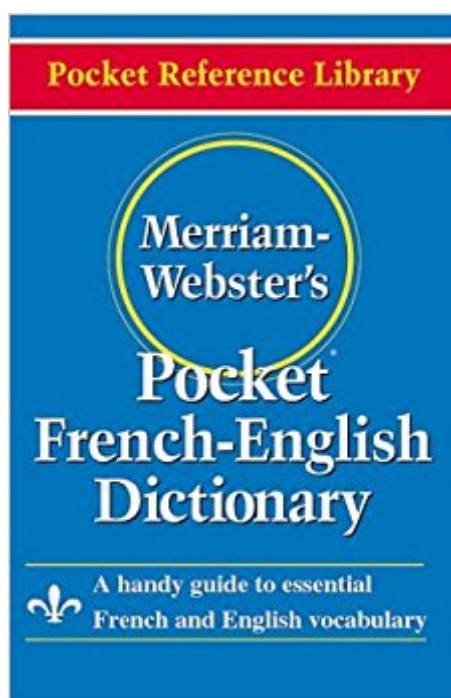


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Merriam-Webster's Pocket French-English Dictionary (Pocket Reference Library)
