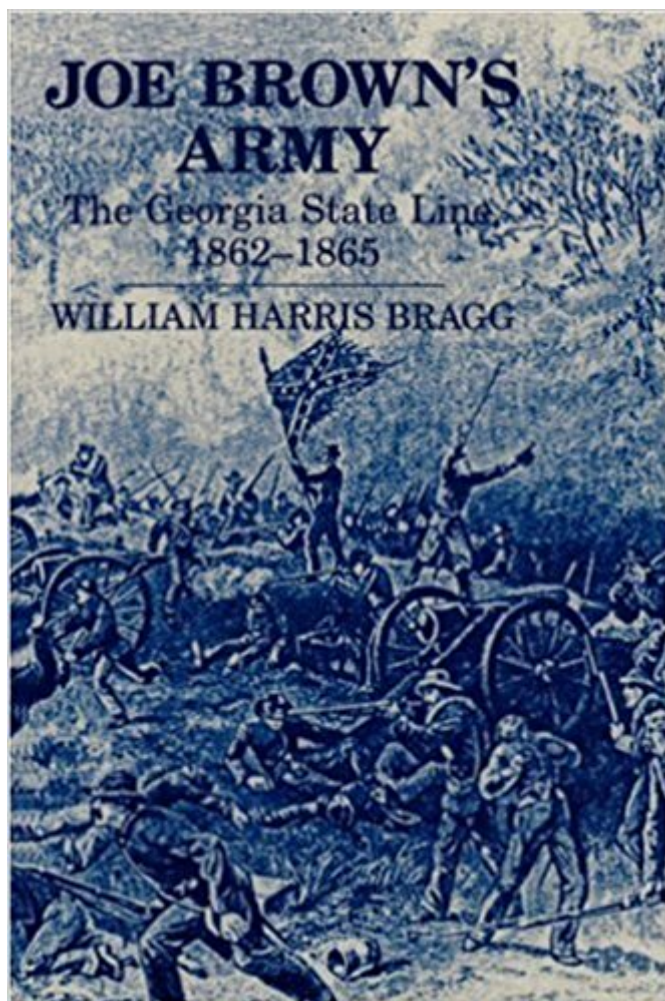

While researching local and family history, I came across a reference to "Joe Brown's Army" and upon further research I found this book that is a gold mine of information on the use and establishment of the Georgia Militia. The author has also indexed the names of soldiers that volunteered to serve and organized those lists by district or county. There's also a great deal of

revelation of how the Confederacy functioned with the ideal of "State Rights" and the tension President Davis and Governor Joe Brown struggled to balance while fighting the war. This is a good read for political thinking readers as well.

Mr. Bragg's book is a well-researched, well-written, and immensely valuable regimental history of this little-known but quite important Georgia unit. The GSL was a crack outfit by any standard, despite being no more than a state militia, and its contributions in the Atlanta and Georgia Campaigns have been sadly overlooked until now. I was pleasantly surprised to find that this book is an entertaining read as well, not common in these narrow subject histories.

This small book is a delight. Small & easy to read yet very enjoyable. In fact we bought two copies and placed one in the county Historical Books section. Highly recommended.

This book covers, as none other has ever attempted, the little known Georgia army The Georgia State Line during the Civil War. Bragg very successfully leads the reader through the tangled web of state units and clearly shows what the State Line was and what it did during the war.
