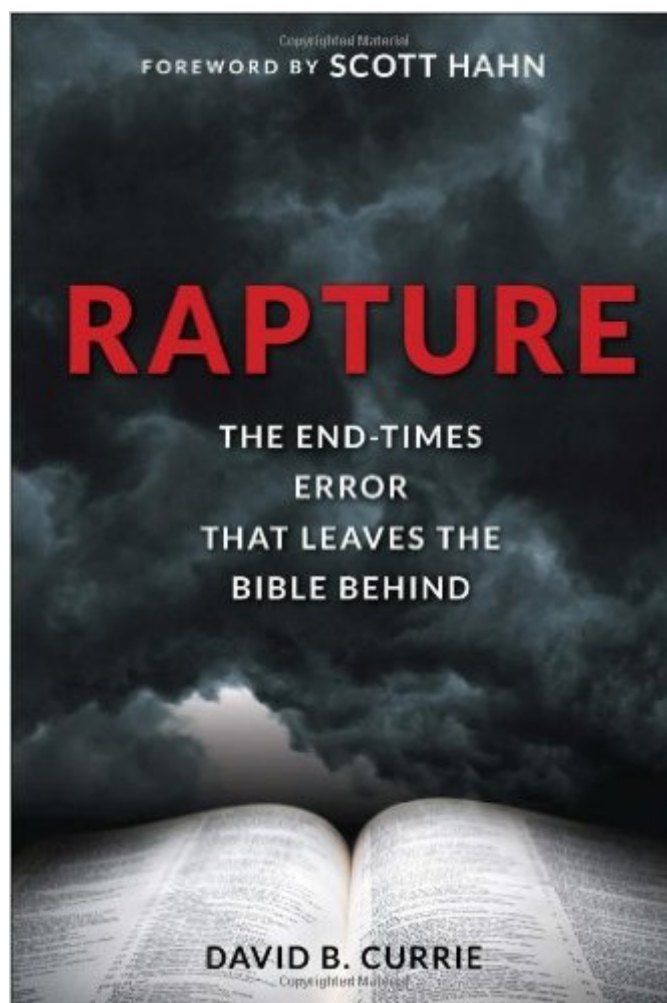


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Rapture: The End-Times Error That Leaves The Bible Behind
