

During the tumultuous era of World War II, the city of London shattered under unrelenting bombs dropped by Nazi Germany. Millions of buildings were destroyed or damaged, tens of thousands of civilians were killed, and survivors were left to ask: How can this destruction be part of God's plan? What is God's will in all of this? After City Temple in London was reduced to rubble, Rev. Leslie Weatherhead crafted five sermons on understanding the will of God to help his congregation endure religious doubt as their city—and church—crumbled around them. Weatherhead's sermons were eventually published as *The Will of God*, a resource that has sold more than a million copies and has been a lifeline for grieving persons seeking to understand God's purpose for their pain. Probably every pastor or church leader will find some part of this book wanting. Too bad... The key concept may not be theologically perfected and may lack some biblical standing, but - it is very helpful, and it is the perfect way to get most American Christians to embrace a more realistic view of reality. Don't blame God, and don't blame everything bad on someone or something. Life isn't fair, but God is good, and it is worth giving your everything in faithful integrity. Too many people get hung up because Weatherhead doesn't meet their theology. Take this for what it is - this is a starting point, a perspective that will get you out of your rut of blaming God or pouring ashes on your head so you can get up and live a faithfully passionate life.

This is a keeper, but it's one I keep buying because I pass it on. I've never read a book twice except this is one I like to re-read. Considering I'm 56 and an avid reader of all genre, that's saying a lot. It answers the mystery of religion in a better conceptual fashion than anything I've ever read.

This book could have been written at any time in history - or the present. It presents the idea that there are different kinds of "God's will" for different situations. In other words, if we don't follow God's ultimate will, there are still ways that His will is done in spite of the way we behave. I highly recommend this book for anyone who doesn't understand why God allows bad things to happen to good people.

Clearly reasoned treatment of the theodicy problem. Not a scholarly treatise, but clear and
