

Richard Cohen's personal experience as a journalist, and with the challenges presented by chronic illness, gives this book extraordinary credibility. As he interviews five people, each with a different illness, we view their unique struggles, sources of strength, and the effect on their relationships with family, friends, and strangers. It is an enlightening and fascinating read, especially for those who

have, or know someone who has, a chronic condition like cancer, ALS, muscular dystrophy, Crohn's disease, multiple sclerosis, or mental illness. The concluding meeting of the five interviewees is a testament to the strength that empathy and hope can bring to the human spirit.

This book was required reading for a family development class which focused on the family and disabilities. This book is a heartfelt read. It is easy to get through and the print is large. I would recommend this book for professionals seeking to understand the impact of disability on the family, or anyone interested in furthering their own understanding of the topic.

I loved the way Robert painted a picture of each person in the book and their individual struggles as well as the commonalities. The only thing that I didn't like was in my own struggle, this made me depressed at times. My story was alittle too close for the 'comfort zone'.

A fantastic - sad but true, book. I think anyone who suffers from any form of chronic illness will get comfort from this book and be able to relate to it on many levels.
